Year 11 and 12 2023 Course Summary and Prerequisites

Summary of anticipated courses for Year 11 and 12 which indicates the prerequisites required in Year 10. Final courses will be dependent on the number of students who select each course. The prerequisites show the Year 10 results students will be required to achieve as a minimum in order to be eligible to select a course as a preference for Year 11. Students will study 6 courses in total in Year 11, and either 5 or 6 in Year 12.

Those choosing the four period per week ATAR or General course will have the 'one period per week' of Private Study in lieu of the one period per week of Religious Studies Endorsed Program.
