



Useful iPad & SEQTA Information for new JSR Parents

Following an extensive trial period and a proof-of-concept project, JSR commenced with the rollout of the iPad BYOD Programme in 2013. Since then, from this year all students in Year 4 to 12 are participants in the programme. As a new parent of a JSR student, you may have questions about the programme, questions about the device, or simply need some assistance in coming to grips with managing the use of this device at home. This document has been put together to assist you in this exercise.

ICT HelpDesk

This is located on the Mirrabooka Campus and is staffed Monday to Friday (8:00am to 4:00pm). Students can come to the HelpDesk during these hours to seek assistance with their iPads and all IT related queries.

Getting Help with the iPad

ICT Support staff are also available to assist parents with any iPad related queries. Just send an email to itsupport@jsracs.wa.edu.au, clearly providing your contact details, your child's details (name and year level) and the nature of the assistance required. Sending this email will generate an internal helpdesk ticket and one of the friendly ICT Support staff will be in touch with you either via email or telephone to assist.

Shared Responsibility

We like to think that giving students an iPad comes with a degree of "shared responsibility". At School we will do our part in upholding our duty of care responsibilities in teaching students the correct way to use and look after their device. We ask that you as parents support this with your children at home and take an active role in the following:

- **Maintaining an Awareness and Visibility** of how the iPad is being used at home to assist your child in their teaching and learning programmes. i.e. Get your child to show you the type of things he/she is doing in class.
- **Internet Usage Rules at Home.** Communicate clearly to your child your expectations of what they can and cannot access online. The Internet has a vast array of information and content and not necessarily everything is suitable for young impressionable eyes. Whilst we take all responsibility to ensure that your child cannot access any undesirable content whilst they are at School, their access to the Internet at home is dependent on what you allow them to access. If your home Internet content is not filtered by your ISP or your router, you may wish to consider setting up restrictions on your child's iPad to keep them away from undesirable content at Home (see next section).

Understanding iPad Restrictions

iPads come with the ability to set Parental Settings. These are called "Restrictions" and can be set up via the [Settings](#) → [Restrictions](#) options. There are a number of settings that can be applied to the device, including restricting access to "Adult" Websites.
